Case Management Update: Since April, the Holston Conference with the United Methodist's case managers have closed 46 cases, completed 249 intakes, and currently have 158 open cases in Carter County. They have hired a third case manager and we are excited for the progress that is being made!

We are looking forward to hosting over 100 volunteers in Carter County this month! We are fortunate to have local groups from T.A. Dugger Middle School, ETSU, and several churches helping with debris cleanup & skilled volunteers coming through TN Baptist Disaster Relief.
